I also thank each one of you again, our donors and friends, for the encouragement you have given to us, and your life saving financial support.

Mission Statement

The St Luc Foundation is a Haitian-led grass-roots humanitarian organization. Over the past twenty-two (22) years through consultation with local leaders throughout the country, St Luc has organically grown to offer an abundance of medical, educational, production and social programs throughout Haiti. We have several focus areas listed below through which our staff dedicate themselves to transforming lives, improving living conditions and strengthening communities.



Difficulties We Faced in 2022

All of St Luc's programs, staff and those being served, continued to suffer from extremely difficult socio-economic conditions: a climate of generalized violence with numerous kidnappings, high inflation, and exponential increase in the cost of living, fuel crisis and the rise in the price at the pump following the standstill of the country from years prior (locally referred to as Peyi lock or "locked country").

The healthcare system in general received fewer patients than years before due to the deterioration of living and development conditions as well as the fuel crisis throughout the country. The central St Luke Hospital in Tabarre was hit hard by the insecurity and rapid degeneration of the immediate surrounding areas of Tabarre, Croix des Bouquet and Torcel. Many clients and community members, fearing for their safety, withdrew from the hospital in 2022.

The Women's Health Clinic, called Manitane, located in Tabarre, saw a 50% reduction in patients in 2022. Due to the fuel crisis and gun violence activities of gangs, the Martina Clinic at Wharf Jeremie inside Cité Soleil, only operated 9 out of the 12 months due to the period of disruption of social life from September to November 2022. Located in Brooklyn, in the heart of Cité Soleil, the St Marie Medical Center, was greatly disrupted by the climate of violence between armed gangs in Cité Soleil and was only able to operate for half the year. However, this did not deter the medical staff, whom we salute for their dedication in extremely difficult conditions.

Aware of this reality, St Luc has been fighting for more than 20 years to offer young Haitians the bread of education. As a result, St Luc has already built 35 schools throughout the country and the schools serve more than 13,000 children each year.

It must be stated that the socio-political and security context of the country has a great impact on the functioning of the education sector in Haiti. The start of this academic year 2022-2023 is above all marked by the socio-economic and political crisis which has shaken the country for too long already. The activities planned at all the St Luc schools this year could not be carried out as planned. One of many examples is the Notre Dame du Rosaire school, located in Croix-des-Bouquets. The school is in an area taken over by the gang called "Baz 400 Marozo." The area is still experiencing daily chaos and clashes between armed groups which have caused the dysfunction of the school.

Children with reduced mobility and handicaps are welcome to attend the St Joan Margareth School. These children are some of the most vulnerable in Haiti. Despite the problems and difficulties encountered, our staff is very motivated to accompany, supervise and teach the students at this school. The teachers at St Joan Margareth school received special recognition from the Education Council for their dedication and hard work this past year with the 122 enrolled students.

Our Focus on Healthcare

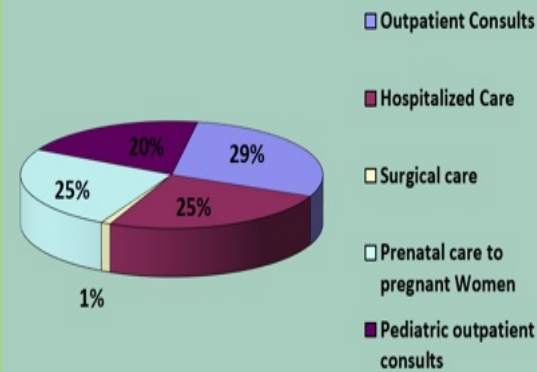
Our medical work starts with the main St Luke Hospital located in Tabarre, and a network of seven (7) referral satellite clinics scattered throughout the five (5) geographic departments in Haiti. The mission is to provide quality care to the community and valuable medical assistance to the Haitian people amid all the daily challenges faced by most living in the country.

The St Luc Medical Programs saw over 30,000 patients through 2022. During the year, there are clinics that were unable to provide services to existing communities due to the climate of insecurity. In several areas' transportation services were brought to a crawl so the number of clients in some areas dropped significantly while other areas like pediatric malnutrition patients almost doubled when compared to previous years. The care provided is largely divided into medical consultations for adults and children, various screenings and urgent hospital care as seen immediately below. Further breakdown by clinic locations follows far below.

Thanks to the resilience of hospital staff, whose courage St Luc salutes, all hospital services functioned and welcomed patients from the community. 75% of the care provided at St Luc Hospital in 2022 focuses on outpatient care and emergency hospitalized patients.

The HIV care program at St Luc Hospital, funded by the Institute of Health and Population for Development (ISPD), screened 1,457 adults in 2022 and enrolled 157 patients on ARVs. The St Luc Hospital HIV Care Program has been rated the Bridge Network's Best Performing Site for 2022. Since April 2020, when the program was launched, 354 patients have been enrolled and are receiving free care.

Finally, for the year 2022, the Breast cancer prevention Clinic of St Luc Hospital, funded by NPH Italia, operates twice a week on Tuesdays and Thursdays, free of charge. In 2022 this program delivered education for 800 women on the danger of breast cancer and on breast self-examination techniques. The clinic provides breast ultrasound sessions which detected 49 suspicious masses. These 49 women were referred for biopsies and specialized care. All these women received regular obstetrical ultrasound, screening for pre-eclampsia and HIV screening and tetanus vaccination and basic paraclinical evaluations and nutritional support for underweight women.

**Manitane Clinic, Tabarre

**Kay O Bwa Recovery Center, Tabarre
Established 2008**

The Kay O Bwa nutritional recovery center is located at the headquarters of the St Luc Foundation in Tabarre. Despite the rising decline in safety and security of the surrounding area, Kay O Bwa has recorded a marked increase in cases of children suffering from severe acute malnutrition. According to the latest United Nation figures, (<https://news.un.org/en/story/2023/05/1137152>) the socio-economic conditions are worsening in Haiti, with nearly 5 million Haitians in a state of food insecurity. In 2022, Kay O Bwa saw a 76% increase of patients as it cared for 3,719 children compared to 2,112 children in 2021. The children seen at Kay O Bwa return weekly and receive nutritional support, a hot meal, and their parents

are given a dry ration kit of pasta and/or milk until their recovery.

The Annual December party at the Kay O Bwa welcomed nearly 300 malnourished children and their parents, in a festive atmosphere with Santa Claus, a bouncy castle and games for children along with a distribution of dishwashing products, gifts for children and food kits for parents.



**Martina Clinic at Wharf Jeremie

The Martina Clinic is crucial in providing essential medicines to a population that otherwise cannot access healthcare.

**St Marie Medical Center
Brooklyn Neighborhood, Cite Soleil
Established 2010**

St Marie Medical Center saw over 1,100 consultations in 2022. Beginning in June, with the outbreak of armed conflict in the city, the Ste Marie Medical Center was transformed into a reception center for victim fleeing the violence. 800+ people were received at the site and around 80 gunshot wounds were transported by a united team of St Luc and Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF, also known as Doctors without Borders) to the Hospital of Médecins Sans Frontières, via a negotiated humanitarian corridor.

As a result of this collaboration, the St Luc Foundation, through a collaboration agreement with MSF, has entrusted the premises of Ste Marie

to the Medical Team of MSF for trauma care and assistance to victims of armed violence, but also medical care of general consultations, and in future community health care with a program for severe acute malnutrition in children and an expanded program of vaccination.

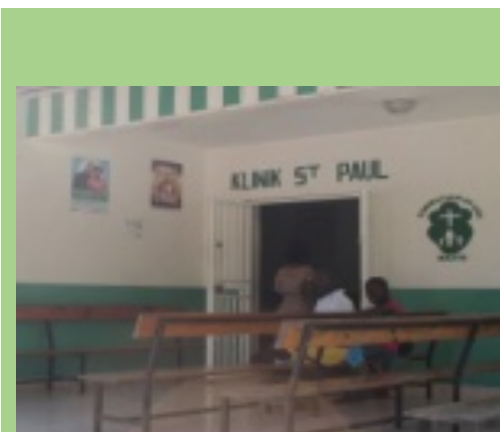
In October 2022, with the resurgence of cholera cases in Haiti, of which Brooklyn was one of the first identified outbreaks, the Ste Marie Medical Center was set up as a first level center by the MSF team treating cholera cases in Cité Soleil. In Brooklyn, more than 300 cholera patients received first aid at Ste Marie.

**St Paul Clinic
St Louis du Sud
Established 2017**

The St Paul Clinic is open Monday through Friday and offers medical consultations and provides medication as needed. In August 2022 a medical laboratory was installed and should be operational by January 2023.

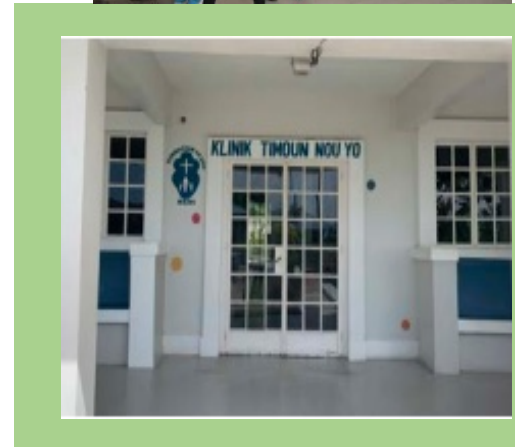

Our Focus on Education

St Luke's education focus, run by the Educational Council located in Tabarre, manages the entire school system including: two (2) vocation training centers and 36 schools from preschool through secondary/high school.

During 2022 the council's focus was to strengthen the educational and administrative structures of the schools through developing and redeveloping specific school spaces, provide schools with qualified and competent teachers, and provide students in the preschool section with materials that can facilitate their learning, and coordinate the work of supervisors at the primary and secondary schools.



Delayed School Openings and Creative Solutions

St Luc schools opened on October 3, one month later than scheduled opening. Four schools St Raphael, St Augustin, St Paul de la Croix and St Andre de Fond des Blancs, are in areas where the schools could open their doors and students could get to and from school relatively safely each day. The Education Council had to get creative for the schools in other areas where safety cannot be guaranteed or fluctuates day to day. These schools implemented online options and created digital groups for communication with teachers, to send notes, homework, and video explanations to students. One obstacle to this alternative is the unreliable availability of or complete lack of internet and electricity. However, the efforts by the Education Council, the school managements and teachers have proven to keep students engaged. We see this when looking at the Notre Dame du Rosaire school which is within the area taken over by the gang Baz 400 Marozo where the gang control all areas of daily life. Despite the chaos of navigating life in this area, the students in 3rd grade passed the state required exams at 83% and the students in the 9th grade class have passed the state required exams at 100%.

2022 Impact of St Luc's Educational Focus through Haiti

Despite the declining situation in Haiti and being faced with rising inflation, many of the St Luc schools were able to complete construction projects or upgrade current buildings with needed improvements. The St Andre school completed several construction projects including adding a second floor with 8 rooms, and section of new bathrooms, and a septic tank.

I learned a lot of things, artistically, socially, etc. The APJ Center showed me the way to live, and to act towards others who do not know the true path of education. For that it is better that I finish my studies by taking a step back and in the future, I think that I will be able to help others who could not go to school. And I have a little advice for those who don't take their studies seriously "You should know that education is the key to your future".

The Center d'Etudes d'Artistes pour la Paix et la Justice (APJ) is a leading institution in the fight to improve and transform the lives of young people in the poorest neighborhoods of the country. The lack of basic social and urban services in these neighborhoods makes these young people easy prey who are continually exposed to the influence of armed gangs. The APJ Center is a genuine reception and support center and a pillar in the fight against juvenile delinquency in Haiti. Education specialists, psychologists, and sociologists, in the area to offer these young people a solid academic and psychological framework. Young people whose integration into a gang was once certain have become professionals and serve the community. The quality of education provided by the APJ Center allows young people to compete with those who attend establishments intended for children from the most well-to-do families.

In 2022 the APJ Center participated in an inter-school soccer championship at Parc Saint Claire in Delmas. We are proud to share that the APJ center won the championship!



Polytechnique Professional Center, Tabarre

Our Focus on Outreach

Words of Peace

The most vulnerable people, especially young people, living in red-light districts need to hear words of peace on a regular basis, because too often they are exposed to violence, crime, and juvenile delinquency.

The St Luc Foundation believes that a word of peace can change a person's entire life. This is why the Outreach program always shows up in violent neighborhoods to bring messages of peace. One of the best ways for the individual to fully reach their true potential is to acquire new knowledge that can awaken their human consciousness. The Outreach service aims to provide 500+ young people, more specifically from underprivileged areas, with awareness sessions on the protection of community assets to safeguard against any possible attack or vandalism.

Rebuild and Restore Dignity

The Outreach program daily strives to restore dignity to as many people as possible. We believe that every individual has the right to have a roof over their head. According to the newspaper *Haiti en Marche*, there are 1,900,000 homeless people in Haiti; most of them live in Port-au-Prince, 700,000. These people live by begging in the streets of Port-au-Prince and in the evening they retire to the city's main cemetery.

The Outreach program has taken the initiative to support 1 or 2 homeless people each month: by renting them a place to sleep with a bed and providing them with the materials necessary to open a small business.

Each year, the Outreach program continues to lead housing construction projects in the most vulnerable areas of the country, including Cité Soleil, Jéremie, and Jacmel.



Education is Bread for Life

Academic instruction has always been the priority of the St Luc because we know education is the most powerful tool that can change the world.

According to UNICEF, 2 out of 10 children, aged 6 to 10, do not go to school each year in Haiti. Faced with this reality, St Luc is obliged to come to the aid underprivileged parents by providing their children with the necessary school supplies for the start of the school year. This year the Outreach program organized a distribution of school kits to the area of Simon Pelé of Cité Soleil. More than 200 children received backpacks, each containing a dozen notebooks, a Geometry box, a pen box, and a box of pencils.



The Right to Healthcare

St Luc believes in the right to healthcare as listed in Article 5 of Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Since its creation, the goal was to provide medical care to the most vulnerable by organizing mobile clinics in areas where the need was felt. Currently, we provide health care to more than 15,000 people per month. In addition to the main St Luc Hospital and the many satellite clinics, St Luc continues to build medical centers in the most remote areas where people have no access to health.

In 2022 the Outreach program started the construction of a health center in Desvarences, Jacmel. This center is projected to receive hundreds of people each month. The facility will include an ER, consultation rooms, laboratory, radiology, maternity, pharmacy, observation room, laundry, reception area, administrative office, records room, and a cafeteria.



Women are the Engine of the Haitian Economy

Women are often single, struggling to raise their children without any assistance. We regularly witness that Haitian women are fighters who mainly live on small daily funds from trade work. The Outreach program honors their courage, and we provide financial assistance when we can and by giving grant funds to women who want to start a small business.

Food Distribution

In 2022 inflation has reached more than 40% in Haiti. This made access to food very difficult for the most vulnerable of the population. The World Food Program (WFP), highlighted the acute humanitarian crisis in Haiti by 4.5 million Haitians require food assistance.

The Outreach program is committed to distributing food kits to the most vulnerable. Every day we receive people in our offices looking for food. We make sure they find it.

In efforts to renew local sustainability and build up national production, we started a native pig farm with 20 sows which can produce at 5-7 piglets per litter. We also have a chicken coop with 200 local chickens and a papaya garden with 300 papaya trees.

Our Focus on Social Enterprise

Despite the rising costs and unavailability of basic elementary goods, and certain production costs reaching untenable levels; the Francisville campus continues to operate at a modest level. This year saw recurring issues in Port-au-Prince which paralyzed imports and the creation of medical oxygen significantly suffered. This situation has motivated St Luc to accelerate the process of increasing our production capacity. Conversely, the bakery operations were forced to come to a halt, and we needed to limit both our pasta and cinder-block productions. St Luc continues to discuss options and strives to find ways to balance our community agreements for production and our obligations to the surrounding communities. In addition to sourcing issues and increasing safety issues in the immediate neighborhood, our staff continue to show up for work with resilience and dedication.

Oxygen Production

Due to the generosity of our international partners NPH-Germany and Franscesca Rava Foundation, our oxygen production has allowed St Luc to be a source of relief for hospitals in Port-au-Prince and neighboring communities. We supply them with top quality medical oxygen at less than 30% of the market cost which has become a lifeline in times of crisis.

Green Energy (START)

START was created to promote renewable energy in Haiti, to improve our capacity to generate critically needed clean energy, and to increase the number of training programs on the ground. St Luc partners with Germain engineers who frequently visit and provide up-to-date information and hands-on training to students.

500KWH solar panels were installed in 2001 and have alleviated both St Luc and our sister organization NPH Haiti's expense of diesel consumption. In 2022, with a 100% increase in diesel fuel prices in the country, we felt obligated to increase our renewable energy capacity to become less dependent on fuel.

Machine Workshops

Our mechanical setting workshop has continued, for more than a decade, to manufacture and to repair equipment parts for machines used throughout St Luc's many focus areas. We have adapted our work to respond to the needs of local industries as well, which helps with income generation.



Vehicle Fleets

The automotive repair shop was created to maintain our fleet of vehicles which consists of 40 vehicles that we share with NPH Haiti. The shop has kept our service vehicles ready and in good condition. Our ambulance fleet (7) is readily available for emergencies 24/7/365. Our vehicles are also used to transport blood to the Red Cross and our own hospitals when there are emergencies.

Villa Francesca and St Luc Guest House

The Francesca Villa and the St Luc Guest House were built to host stakeholders, volunteers, and friends of St Luc and NPH Haiti. Under normal conditions, volunteers would come in from Europe and the United States year-round to offer their contributions to our various social programs.

Since 2018, due to political unrests, then Covid, generalized insecurity and gang activities which have deprived these places of regular guests. St Luc has been using the Villa to house its personnel (notably its medical staff) who for the most part come from the neighborhoods in Port-au-Prince that are affected by the insecurity. This is a way for St Luc to support its employees while they in turn alleviate the suffering of the most vulnerable and to earn a dignified living.

Smart Solar Grid, Tabarre (SSGT)

The central hybrid grid (SSGT), composed of photovoltaic solar energy and a power generator, aims to produce electrical power to feed both St Luc and NPH Haiti's campuses in Tabarre. The solar installation was completed in 2022 and uses maximum solar power: 578KWc; Lithium storage batteries (450KWh capacity); 4 500 KVA inverters, and three 1.2 MW power generators). Installation also included a diesel pump for fuel transfer and pipework to connect the old diesel tank to a new tank and reconditioning of the C18 Caterpillar generator. St Luc is currently under evaluation and preparation for the extension of the Smart Grid to reach toward the APJ School, the Polytechnic School, and Villa Francesca as well as NPH Haiti's FWAL building and Baby House.

Since the beginning of September, SGGT, has steadily improved its performance through significantly reducing the use of diesel in the production process while increasing the use of renewable energy (both solar and storage).
